

NEBRASKA BRAND COMMITTEE RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rule 3. Distribution of Brand Books.

So far as is practicable, complimentary copies of the Nebraska Brand Book (with supplements) shall be distributed to county sheriffs in the brand area and to State Safety Patrol members whose assignments are within the brand area.

Such copies shall be distributed at each printing of the brand book.

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Rule 7 - Registration and Regulation of Feedlots Within the Brand Inspection Area

- 7-(1) Application and Agreement. Owner or owners must complete an application and agreement for a special Registered Feedlot Permit, in writing, on forms furnished by the Nebraska Brand Committee, 411 Niobrara, P.O. Box I, Alliance, NE 69301, telephone 308/763-2930, or on our website www.nol.org/home/NBC.
- 7-(2) Fee. The application shall be accompanied by a payment of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than six hundred fifty dollars for each one thousand head or less capacity and an equal amount for each additional one thousand head capacity, or part thereof, of the applicants feedlot. This payment to be refunded in full should this application be denied.
- 7-(3) Prior inspection. Applicant shall permit inspection of the feedlot by authorized personnel of The Nebraska Brand Committee, prior to issuance of the permit, and shall furnish any additional pertinent information as may be requested.
- 7-(4) Inception date. Permits shall be in force for one (1) year from date of issuance. Application for renewal shall be made in writing 30 days prior to expiration of existing permit.
- 7-(5) Fee change. Any change in the Registration fee shall not be reflected until the next renewal date, at which time the applicant will be duly notified in advance.
- 7-(6) Exception to law. Any cattle within the confines of the feedlot on the date initial application is made for Registered status shall be subject to an audit. The audit shall determine the number of head, ownership status and point of origin immediately prior to being placed in the feedlot.
- 7-(7) Inventory. An inventory of all cattle placed in the Registered Feedlot after the permit issuance date, shall be kept by the applicant on a form prescribed by the

Nebraska Brand Committee, 411 Niobrara, P.O. Box I, Alliance, NE 69301, telephone 308/763-2930, or on a set of documents which includes the same essential information as required by the Committee's form.

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AGREEMENT:

This agreement, made and entered into this _____ day of _____ 19____ by and between the Nebraska Brand Committee, a committee existing under and by virtue of the provisions of State Statutes 54-159 to 54-168, hereinafter referred to as the first party, and _____ whose address is _____ hereinafter referred to as the second party, WITNESSETH: That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements, hereinafter set out to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, have this day agreed as follows:

1. Owner or owners must make application for a special Registered Feedlot Permit, in writing, on forms furnished by the Nebraska Brand Committee.
2. The application shall be accompanied by a payment of \$_____ per one thousand head capacity of the Applicants feedlot. This payment to be refunded in full should this application be denied.
3. Applicant shall permit inspection of the feed lot by authorized personnel of The Nebraska Brand Committee, prior to issuance of the permit, and shall furnish any additional pertinent information as may be requested.
4. Permits shall be in force for one (1) year from date of issuance. Application for renewal shall be made in writing 30 days prior to expiration of existing permit.
5. Any change in the Registration fee shall not be reflected until the next renewal date, at which time the applicant will be duly notified in advance.
6. Any cattle within the confines of the feedlot on the date initial application is made for Registered status shall be subject to an audit. The audit shall determine number of head, ownership status and point of origin immediately prior to being placed in feedlot.
7. An inventory of all cattle placed in the Registered Feedlot after the permit issuance date, shall be kept by the applicant on a form approved by The Nebraska Brand Committee.

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RULE 8 - RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE MOVEMENT OF CATTLE FROM THE NEBRASKA BRAND INSPECTION AREA FOR SHOW OR EXHIBITION PURPOSES

- (1) Any resident of the Nebraska Brand Inspection Area shall upon request be allowed to remove cattle from the Nebraska Brand Inspection Area with a single seasonal brand

inspection being performed by the Nebraska Brand Committee for purposes of exhibition, showing or judging, if the following stipulations are met:

- (a) The cattle being removed shall bear individual, permanent identification.
- (b) For the purposes of this Rule and Regulation, a brand as described in Section 1, 54-101 shall not be considered individual identification.
- (c) The Nebraska Brand Committee shall make one initial brand inspection on the cattle to be removed for such purposes as stated in Section (1)
- (d) The Nebraska Brand Committee shall issue a certificate of inspection to the owner of the cattle that shall describe the cattle so inspected as to sex, breed, color, brands, earmarks, tattoos, tags or any other individual identification as provided in Section (a).
- (e) The inspection certificate shall carry the notation: FOR SHOW PURPOSES ONLY - NOT TRANSFERABLE - EXPIRES ONE YEAR FROM DATE OF ISSUANCE.
- (f) The certificate of inspection shall be valid for a period of one year from date of issuance or until such time that there is a change of ownership of the cattle described on the certificate of inspection.
- (g) Should the cattle so described be sold, slaughtered or traded within the Nebraska Brand Inspection Area or at any market where the Nebraska Brand Committee maintains inspection, the cattle shall be subject to another brand inspection as provided by statute and the certificate of inspection issued under the provisions of the Rule and Regulation shall be surrendered to the Nebraska Brand Committee.

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- (h) If the cattle so described are still in the noted owners possession after one year from issuance of the certificate of inspection, another certificate of inspection must be obtained from the Nebraska Brand Committee before the cattle so described can be removed from the Nebraska Brand Inspection Area.
- (i) The certificate of inspection issued under this Rule and Regulation shall accompany the cattle described thereon anytime the cattle leave the Nebraska Brand Inspection Area.
- (j) Any intentional misuse of the certificates or privileges herein stated shall subject the holder to immediate revocation of all certificates by the Nebraska Brand Committee.

This Rule and Regulation does not pertain to any other state's law or Rules and Regulations, and does not exempt any cattle from an inspection in another state

Rule 9 - Registration and Regulation of Dairies Within the Brand Inspection Area

9-(1) Application and Agreement. Owner or owners must complete an application and agreement for a special Registered Dairy Permit, in writing, on forms furnished by the Nebraska Brand Committee, 411 Niobrara, P.O. Box I, Alliance, NE 69301, telephone 308/763-2930, or on our website www.nol.org/home/NBC.

- 9-(2) Fee. The application shall be accompanied by a payment of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than six hundred fifty dollars for each one thousand head or less capacity and an equal amount for each additional one thousand head capacity, or part thereof, of the applicants dairy. This payment to be refunded in full should this application be denied.
- 9-(3) Prior inspection. Applicant shall permit inspection of the dairy by authorized personnel of The Nebraska Brand Committee, prior to issuance of the permit, and shall furnish any additional pertinent information as may be requested.
- 9-(4) Inception date. Permits shall be in force for one (1) year from date of issuance. Application for renewal shall be made in writing 30 days prior to expiration of existing permit.
- 9-(5) Fee change. Any change in the Registration fee shall not be reflected until the next renewal date, at which time the applicant will be duly notified in advance.
- 9-(6) Exception to law. Any cattle within the confines of the dairy on the date initial application is made for Registered status shall be subject to an audit. The audit shall determine the number of head, ownership status and point of origin immediately prior to being place in the dairy.
- 9-(7) Inventory. An inventory of all cattle placed in the Registered Dairy after the permit issuance date, shall be kept by the applicant on a form prescribed by the Nebraska Brand Committee, 411 Niobrara, P.O. Box I, Alliance, NE 69301, telephone 308/763-2930, or on a set of documents which includes the same essential information as required by the Committee's form.
