## LEGISLATURE OF 1925

## SENATORS

W. B. BANNING (Democrat). Second district. Member of senate in 1909, 1911 and 1923. Born at Wyoming, Nebraska in September, 1869. Ancestry English. Educated in district schools and graduate of Lincoln business college. Married Jennie E. Roush, September 6, 1899; one child. Is a farmer and horticulturist. Has been county commissioner. Member M. W. A.; A. F. and A. M. Address: Union.

HENRY BEHRENS (Republican). Twelfth district. Representative in 1917, 1919, 1921 and senator in 1923. Born on a farm in Benton county, Missouri, in 1864, of German parents. Educated in the public schools of Missouri. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Married Elizabeth Sila, and they have two children. Has been a farmer and vice-president of the First national bank of Beemer. Member Lutheran church. Address: Beemer.

CLARENCE GEORGE BLISS (Republican). Twenty-fifth district. Senator in 1921 and 1923. Born at Shelton, Nebraska, May 10, 1883. Ancestry English and Pennsylvania German. Mother came from England in 1870. Married Jessie Stebbins, January 6, 1912; three children. Public and high school education. Is president of City bank of Elm Creek; also interested in farming and stockraising. County federal food administrator during the World war. Member of Methodist church, Elks, and Kearney Country Club. Address: Elm Creek.

WILLIAM NEWTON CHAMBERS (Republican). Fourth district. Representative in 1915 and senator in 1923. Born at Omaha, Nebraska, July 21, 1879. Ancestry English-Scotch. Educated in Omaha public schools, high school, Smith's academy, St. Louis; graduated from the University of Michigan law school, 1902. Married Ruth Byrne; one daughter. Is a lawyer. Has been contractor. Member of Elks, Omaha Athletic Club, Omaha Field Club, Nebraska State Bar Association, Omaha Bar Association. Address: Omaha.

JOHN WILLIAM COOPER (Republican). Seventh district. Was born in Indiana in 1867. Graduated from the Rising Sun, Indiana, high school. Lived in Nebraska since 1892. Is a practicing attorney. Was state senator in 1919, 1921 and 1923. Is Protestant and a member of the following fraternal organizations: Masons, Knights of Pythias and Odd Fellows. Address: Omaha.

FRANK DOLEZAL (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Was born March 2, 1867, at Sokol, Bohemia. His parents came to America in 1877, settling in Nebraska. Was educated in the public schools. Married Katherine Zimola April 8, 1891. Has five children. Has been a member of the school board and a precinct assessor. Served in the house of representatives in 1909 and 1911. Is a farmer. Member of the Catholic church. Is interested in travel and has made several tours through Europe. Address: Wahoo.

THOMAS B. DYSART (Republican). Fifth district. Born in Monroe county, Ohio, in 1872, of Scotch and Irish ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1879. Attended the law school of the University of Michigan. Is an attorney. He is unmarried. Is a Presbyterian, a member of the Omaha Athletic Club, Omaha Chamber of Commerce, Elks, Knights of Pythias, and Royal Arcanum. Was a member of the house of representatives in 1921 and 1923. Is a son of William Dysart, state senator in 1891 and 1893. Address: Omaha.

HENRY E. GOODRICH (Republican). Twenty-seventh district. Was born in Sciotoville, Ohio, July 4, 1859. Moved to Nebraska in 1885. Was married Feb. 6, 1895 to Leola Munger; remarried Aug. 30, 1909 to Ida M. Bosserman. Has

three children. His ancestors came to America from England in 1642. Was educated in the public schools of Sciotoville, Ohio, and in the township high school. Is engaged in the mercantile business. Has served on the city board and on the school board. Is president of the Nuckolls county building and loan association. Was a member of the house of representatives in 1919 and 1921. He is a Methodist. Is a member of the Masons, Order of the Eastern Star and of the Modern Woodmen of America. Address: Nelson.

DWIGHT PALMER GRISWOLD (Republican). Thirty-second district. Was born at Harrison, Nebraska, November 27, 1893. His ancestors came to America from England before the Revolutionary war. Educated in Gordon high school, Kearney military academy, Nebraska Wesleyan university, and the University of Nebraska, being graduated there in 1914. Served two years in the army, and received his discharge as a captain in the field artillery. Was married Sept. 25, 1919 to Erma Elliott. They have one daughter. Was formerly a bank cashier. Is now editor of the Gordon Journal. He was a member of the house of representatives in 1921. Is a member of the Presbyterian church, of the Masons, Kiwanis Club, American Legion and Alpha Tau Omega (college fraternity). Address: Gordon.

CORNELIUS T. HECHT (Republican and Progressive). Tenth district. Was born at St. Helena, Nebraska, Dec. 13, 1884, of Danish and German parents, who came to America from Schleswig-Holstein in 1870. Was educated in the St. Helena schools. Married Christina Hovland August 20, 1907. They have two children. Was formerly in the lumber business. Has been a banker since 1906. Has been city treasurer and president of the board of education. Attends the Methodist church. Is a Mason. Address: Bloomfield.

WILLIAM D. HOLBROOK (Republican). Eighth district. Representative in 1897 and senator in 1895, 1899 and 1907. Member of constitutional convention, 1919-1920. Born at Scottsville, Missouri, April 17, 1850. Parents American; ancestors Scotch and German. Attended rural school in Missouri, and later attended night school. Married Addie R. Mahan in 1875; five children. Came to Nebraska in 1878. Has always been a farmer. Was justice of the peace for thirty-two years. Secretary and manager of the Farmers' mutual insurance association for twenty-two years. Affiliates with a Protestant church. Belongs to many farm organizations and social societies. Address: Ames.

CHARLES WILLIAM HOYE (Republican). Third district. Was born at Omaha, Nebraska, August 27, 1891. His ancestors came to this country from England in 1869. Attended the public schools. Was married June 18, 1913, to Mae Fagarty. Has two children. He is a salesman. Has been deputy sheriff of Douglas county. Affiliates with the Episcopalian church. Is a member of the Elks. Address: Omaha.

GEORGE CURRIER HUMPHREY (Republican). Twenty-fourth district. Born in Athens county, Ohio, January 28, 1846. Came to Nebraska in 1874. English ancestors came to Massachusetts in 1643. Widower; seven children. Common school education. A carpenter and farmer. Member board of supervisors, Hall county, 1894-1895; Nebraska house of representatives, 1901; senator in 1921; deputy collector internal revenue, Fifth and Seventh divisions, Nebraska, 1902-1915. Hall county assessor, 1917-1920. Member Congregational church; Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Masons, Modern Woodmen, Ancient Order of United Workmen and G. A. R. Served three years and six months in the Civil war. Deceased, 1925.

WILLIAM HENRY ILLIAN (Republican). Twenty-first district. Senator in 1921 and 1923. Born in Scott county, Iowa, June 30, 1858. Came to Nebraska, January 3, 1890. Married Adda Fox, October 6, 1897, who died January 23, 1898. Married Mrs. Elizabeth Geedom, September 26, 1916. His father was born in Waldeck, Germany, November 11, 1831, and came to America in 1851. Common

school education. Has retired; was formerly a farmer, school teacher and banker. Has been postmaster at Humphrey, Nebraska, member of city council of Albion for eight years, mayor of Albion for two years. Member of Presbyterian church. Masonic orders, Knights of Pythias, Modern Woodmen and Royal Highlanders. Address: Albion.

CLARK JEARY (Republican). Fourteenth district. Born in Lincoln, Nebraska, April 25, 1892. His father was born in England; his mother in America. Educated in the Lincoln public schools, the University of Nebraska and the University of Michigan. Married in July, 1914 to Marie Minor; has one daughter. He is a lawyer. Was state representative in 1919 and 1921. Attends the Christian church. He is a member of the Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite Masons, Shriners and Knights of Pythias. Address: Lincoln.

CHARLES WILLIAM JOHNSON (Republican). Thirty-first district. Born in Sweden, February 21, 1864. Came to America with his parents in 1868. Settled in Nebraska in 1886. LOUIS HERMAN KERR (Democrat and Progressive). Thirtieth district. Was born in Laddonia, Mo., coming to Nebraska in 1886. His paternal grandfather was Scotch; his other ancestors native born. Educated in the North Platte high school. Was married in 1922. He is a stock raiser and farmer. President of the county Farmers' union organization and secretary-treasurer of the Lincoln county taxpayers' league. He is a Methodist. LOREN H. LAUGHLIN (Republican). Sixteenth district. Was born at Mount Ayr, Iowa, in 1896. His paternal ancestors, English and Scotch Irish, came to America in the seventeenth century. His maternal ancestors came from Germany in the nineteenth century. Was educated in the Mount Ayr and Des Moines, Iowa, public schools and in Drake university. Was married in 1918 to Marie Chance; has two children. Came to Nebraska in 1919. Was formerly assistant counsel to the Iowa railroad commission and to the Iowa code revision commission. J. C. MCGOWAN (Republican). Eleventh district. Senator in 1921 and 1923. Born at Centralia, Missouri, February 19, 1869. Father came from Ireland in 1845. Married; one child. Common school education. Is a machinist; formerly a teacher. Member of Christian church; Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Sons of Veterans, Machinists union, Woodmen of the World, Ancient Order of United Workmen, and Benefit association of railway employees. CHARLES H. MEACHAM, JR., (Republican). Eighteenth district. Senator in 1923. Born at Phillipsburg, New Jersey, March 1, 1878. Paternal ancestry was from New England; maternal of German descent. Came to Nebraska in 1879. Educated at Peru state normal, Peru, Nebraska and the University of Nebraska. Married Eva Waren, March 30, 1904; one child. Is a merchant. Has been public

school instructor; member of board of education at Dorchester, Nebraska. Member of the Methodist Episcopal church and Masonic Lodge. Address: Dorchester.

EMERSON R. PURCELL (Democrat). Twenty-third district. Representative in 1919 and senator in 1923. Born at Springfield, Illinois, 1866. Irish and English ancestry. Educated in public schools at Crete, Nebraska, and also attended Doane college. Married and has five children. Has been editor of the Custer County Chief at Broken Bow for twenty-seven years. Was mayor for two terms; member of board of education and a member of board of managers State board of agriculture. Belongs to the Episcopal church, Masons (York and Scottish Rites, Shriners) and Odd Fellows. Address: Broken Bow.

PERRY A. C. REED (Republican). Nineteenth district. Representative in 1917 and senator in 1919, 1921 and 1923. Born on a farm near Monroe, Wisconsin, January 22, 1871. His paternal grandfather was a soldier in the Revolutionary war. Came to Nebraska in 1876. Received his education in the country schools of Nebraska. Married Abbie L. Westcott in 1896. Is a member of the Odd Fellows. Address: Henderson.

JOHN W. ROBBINS (Republican). Sixth district. Was born in Kent, Indiana. Is of English ancestry. Has lived in Omaha, Nebraska, since coming there in 1885, after graduating from Hanover college, Hanover, Indiana, in 1884. Married Isabel Wyman in 1894 and they are the parents of four children, a son and three daughters. Is a realtor and has a general insurance agency. Was a member of the state senate in 1919, 1921, 1923 and 1925 sessions. During the 1925 session he was president pro tempore of the senate. PERLEE W. SCOTT (Republican). Twenty-ninth district. Was born in Kirksville, Iowa, July 24, 1860. His ancestors migrated from Ireland to America in 1800. Educated in the Iowa public schools and Parsons college at Fairfield, Iowa. Settled in Nebraska in 1885. Married Jessie Ware, November 6, 1892. Has three children. He is a lawyer. Has been a member of the school board and the Imperial town board. He was county attorney of Chase county for twenty years and was a member of the constitutional convention of 1919-20. HARRY BROOKS SHELLNBARGER (Democrat). Twenty-eighth district. Senator in 1923. Was born in Warren county, Illinois, December 27, 1874. German-Scotch-English ancestry. Came to Nebraska 1883. Educated at Stella, Nebraska, high school. Married Myra Shranger April 9, 1905. They have one child. Farmer and live stock raiser. Is a Protestant and a member of A. F. & A. M. Address: Stamford.

RALPH R. VANCE (Republican). Twenty-sixth district. Born at Ripley, Ohio, in 1869. His ancestors were Scotch and Irish. He settled in Nebraska in 1887. Was educated in the common schools. He married Anna V. Frisch, March 12, 1905. They have two children. Has engaged in farming, milling, grain buy-

ing and banking. He attends the Presbyterian church. Was a state representative in 1919, 1921, and 1923. Has been vice president of the State bank of Hastings for six years, vice president of the Hastings milling company for eight years, secretary of the Farmers grain and supply company for eleven years, director of the Hastings mutual fire insurance company for eleven years and township treasurer for three years. CHARLES JOSEPH WARNER (Republican). Fifteenth district. Representative in 1901, 1903, 1905 and state senator in 1919, 1921 and 1923. Born in Lancaster county, Nebraska, 1875, of Swedish ancestry. Attended Lutheran academy in 1891-1892, Lincoln normal university, 1894, and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1899, and from the Columbian law school, Washington, D. C., 1902. CHAS. J. WATSON (Republican). Seventeenth district. Was born in Illinois, coming to Nebraska in 1883. His ancestors came to America from Ireland. He was educated in Hedding college. Was married in Sept. 1891 to Laura Hofrichter; has three children. He has been a farmer since 1883. Has served on the city council and on the school board. He attends the Methodist church. GEORGE WILKINS (Republican). Ninth district. Born at Homer, Nebraska, June 23, 1883. German ancestry. Educated in country schools from 1890-99. Married Cora E.
