LEGISLATURE OF 1931-1932

SENATORS

CHARLES E. ALLEN (Republican). Thirtieth district. Senator in 1923. Born at Russell, Iowa, January 8, 1865. Scotch ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Attended Russell high school. Married Susan L. Morrow, August 29, 1899; six children. Is a merchant. Is member of Protestant church and Masons including 32nd degree and Shrine. Address: Cozad.

CRIST ANDERSEN (Democrat). Twenty-second district. Representative in 1913, 1915, and 1917. Born at Cedar Falls, Iowa, September 10, 1867, and came to Nebraska in 1880. Both his parents came from Denmark. His education was obtained in the public schools of Iowa and Nebraska. He is a farmer. Was county supervisor of Boyd county for six years and has held the office of precinct assessor. Attends the Methodist church. He is an Odd Fellow and a member of the Ancient Order of United Workmen. Address: Bristow.

JAMES A. AXTELL (Republican). Seventeenth district. Representative in 1917, 1919, 1921. Born in Athens county, Ohio, January 13, 1870. Moved with his parents to Nebraska in the same year. He was educated in both public and private schools. Mr. Axtell taught school for fourteen years, engaged in the real estate and insurance business for ten years and is now farming and raising pure bred cattle and hogs. He is a member of the Methodist church, and of the Masonic lodge (Knight Templar, Scottish Rite), Elks, Moose, Odd Fellows, Modern Woodmen of America. Address: Fairbury.

HENRY BEHRENS (Republican). Twelfth district. Representative in 1917, 1919, 1921 and senator in 1923, 1925, 1927. Born on a farm in Benton county, Missouri, in 1864, of German parents. Educated in the public schools of Missouri. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Married Elizabeth Sila; two children. Has been a farmer and vice-president of the First National Bank of Beemer. Member of Lutheran church. Address: Beemer.

JOHN EDWARD BOWMAN (Republican). Twenty-fifth district. Born at Streator, Illinois, September 15, 1878. Mother a native of United States; father came from England in 1873. Parents moved to Nebraska in 1879. Married January 16, 1907 to Carrie Luella Keef. Attended York county schools and graduated from the medical department of Cotner university, 1912. Is a physician and farmer. Has been mayor, county physician and state senator in 1929. Belongs to Presbyterian church, Masonic lodge, Scottish Rite, Shrine, Knights of Pythias, Odd Fellows and Rotary club. Address: Loup City.

ARTHUR E. BOWRING (Republican). Thirty-second district. Born at Dow City, Iowa, April 20, 1873. Came to Nebraska in 1885. Married January 22, 1908 to Mabel Holbrook of Ames, Nebraska. Father came from England and mother from Scotland about 1850. Attended common schools. Is a stock raiser. Has been a school director, road overseer, county commissioner for fifteen years, member of house of representatives in 1927 and 1929 and the senate in 1930. Is a Protestant. Member of Odd Fellows, Woodmen and Royal Neighbors. Address: Merriman.

OLIVER G. CLARK (Republican). Twentieth district. Born in Unionville, Missouri. Came to Nebraska in 1911. Married April 26, 1908 to Mabelle S. Sanford; two sons. Graduate of Palmer chiropractic college at Davenport, Iowa. Is a chiropractor. Was president of Platte valley chiropractic association, 1916, chairman of legislative committee of State chiropractic association, 1918-1923, and president of Nebraska chiropractic association, 1925-1926. State senator in 1929. Address: Columbus.

JOHN WILLIAM COOPER (Republican). Seventh district. Was born in Indiana in 1867. Graduated from the Rising Sun, Indiana, high school. Lived in Nebraska since 1892. Is a practicing attorney. Was state senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929; president pro tem in 1929. Member and secretary of Ne-

braska-Iowa boundary commission. Is a Protestant and member of the following fraternal organizations: Masons, 33rd degree, Knights of Pythias and Odd Fellows. Address: Omaha.

GUS A. DWORAK (Democrat). Third district. Born in Omaha, August 20, 1895. Parents came from Bohemia in 1887. Graduate of public schools and Boyles college. Married April 25, 1917 to Marie Anna Vak; four children. Is a bookkeeper and stenographer. Was agent for Travelers' insurance company for eight years and bookkeeper for Western electric company for four years. Served as secretary for a city commissioner of Omaha. State senator in 1929. Is a Roman Catholic. Address: Omaha.

HARRY K. EASTON (Democrat). Fourth district. Born in Belleville, Kansas. Came to Nebraska in 1890. Married Anna Myrtle Rasp, September 29, 1928. Ancestors were Irish, Scotch and French. Attended grammar and high schools and Creighton university. Has been a merchant; is now a finance broker. Is a veteran of World war. Chairman of Nebraska Democratic club. Belongs to Episcopal church and American Legion. Address: Omaha.

GEORGE F. FRUSH (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Born at Pleasantville, Iowa, in 1861. Came to Nebraska in 1882. Married September 6, 1885, to May E. Evans; two children. Ancestors came from Ohio. Attended high school at Knoxville, Iowa, and Professor McKee's academy. Took courses in bookkeeping and accounting. Was formerly a farmer and shipped live stock. Is now secretary and manager of Wahoo mutual loan and building association. Was a member of city council four years, city treasurer three years, county treasurer four years, county assessor four years, chairman of board of equalization four years and state senator in 1927 and 1929. Is a Presbyterian. Belongs to I. O. O. F. lodge and Rebekah lodge, and Modern Woodmen. Address: Wahoo.

CHARLES WILLIAM JOHNSON (Republican). Thirty-first district. State senator in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born in Sweden, February 21, 1864. Came to America with his parents in 1868. Settled in Nebraska in 1886. Attended Swedish school and public and high schools. Was married April 21, 1885, to Ellen C. Nelson. Has nine children. Is a farmer, rancher, merchant and banker. Has served on the school board for thirty years, on the town board for ten years and as postmaster fourteen years. Has been county assessor. He affiliates with the Methodist church. Is a member of the Masons Consistory 32° and Shrine, W. O. W., A. O. U. W., Odd Fellows, and Eastern Star. Address: Potter.

GEORGE GRAVES KOSTER (Democrat). Tenth district. Born at Niobrara, Nebraska, September 23, 1881. His father came from Germany in 1861; his mother from Bohemia in 1864. Attended public schools. Married Florence Bell Reid, January 15, 1903; four children. Is a hotel-keeper. Has been state game warden, and boxing commissioner. Is a member of the town board. Address: Niobrara.

HARRY LEIGHTON KUNKEL (Democrat). Twenty-first district. Born at Shippensburg, Cumberland county, Pennsylvania, July 8, 1866. Ancestors came from Holland. Came to Nebraska in 1877. Attended public schools. Married Edith Mae McNeal, June 19, 1912; four children. Is a farmer and live stock breeder. Has been president of Boone county fair, treasurer of his school district, and president of Boone county farmers' mutual insurance company. Is a member of the Congregational church. Belongs to the Odd Fellows, Knights of Pythias, and Kiwanis club. Address: Albion.

J. C. MCGOWAN (Republican). Eleventh district. Senator in 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born at Centralia, Missouri, February 19, 1869. Father came from Ireland in 1845. Married; one child. Common school education. Is a machinist; formerly a teacher. Member of Christian church; Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Sons of Veterans, Machinists' union, Woodmen of the World, Ancient Order of United Workmen, and Benefit association of railway employees. Address: Norfolk.

E. M. NEUBAUER (Democrat). Twenty-eighth district. Representative in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born at Oxford, Nebraska, in 1885. His father came to America from Germany at age of sixteen. His mother also of German descent. Educated in the public schools and Hastings college. Married November 22, 1906, to Annetta Davis; has two children. Has been employed in the hardware business. Is at present a farmer and stock raiser. Is a member of the school board. Has been township clerk, president of Farmers' elevator for five years, secretary-treasurer of Farmers' butter factory for three years. Is a Presbyterian. Member of the Modern Woodmen. Address: Orleans.

ARTHUR L. NEUMANN (Democrat). Ninth district. Born at Andover, Illinois, February 3, 1870. Came to Nebraska in 1881. Unmarried. Father came from Germany in 1857 and mother from Sweden in 1849. Attended Oakland, Nebraska, schools. Has been a banker since 1892; was formerly a clerk. State senator in 1927 and 1929. Belongs to Masons, Elks and Odd Fellows. Address: Oakland.

HENRY PEDERSEN (Democrat). Twenty-seventh district. Native Nebraskan. Born at Hardy, January 2, 1893. Parents came from Denmark. Attended Nuckolls county schools and Nebraska State Agricultural College. Married Doris May Sims, February 24, 1915; three children. Is a farmer and stockman. Was a director of school and church boards and district farmers union. Is president of the Farmers' Union local organization, director of Farmers' Union co-operative creameries of Nebraska, executive director of Webster county Farm Bureau, and director of Guide Rock state bank. Is a member of the Lutheran church, and the following fraternal orders: Rebekah, I. O. O. F., Patriarchal Encampment, Samaritan, and Masons. Address: Guide Rock.

WILLIAM HENRY PITZER (Republican). Second district. Native Nebraskan. Born in Arizona, Burt county, February 3, 1869. American ancestry. Attended public schools. Married Fern Miller, November 4, 1904; two children. Lawyer since 1899. Has been secretary of the Nebraska City Building and Loan Association since 1901. Was a member of the board of education for eleven years; of the Nebraska Constitutional convention, 1919-20; of the Board of Education of State Normal schools, 1929-30. Is a farmer and stockman. Address: Nebraska City.

WILLIAM LESLIE RANDALL (Republican). Fifth district. Born in Omaha, May 14, 1889. Is of Scottish ancestry. Married December 29, 1917 to Florence B. Hill; three children. Graduated from Omaha high school and holds degree of LL.B., 1913, from college of law, University of Nebraska. Is a lawyer. Member of Nebraska house of representatives 1921, and state senate 1929. Belongs to Presbyterian church, Sigma Nu, Elks and Lions' club. Address: Omaha.

PERRY A. C. REED (Republican). Nineteenth district. Representative in 1917 and senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born on a farm near Monroe, Wisconsin, January 22, 1871. His paternal grandfather was a soldier in the Revolutionary war. Came to Nebraska in 1876. Received his education in the country schools of Nebraska. Married Abbie L. Westcott in 1896. Is a member of the Odd Fellows. Address: Henderson.

JAMES A. RODMAN (Republican). Sixth district. Born May 6, 1887 at Salem, Indiana. Ancestors came to America in early eighteenth century from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Came to Nebraska in 1888. Graduated from Blair, Nebraska, high school and the University of Nebraska. Married August 15, 1914 to Helen I. Lawrence of Fremont. Has four sons. Taught school, practiced law, and is at present a life insurance executive. Was county attorney of Kimball county, 1915-1919, and county attorney of Banner county, 1917-1919. Served in House of representatives from Kimball county in 1919 and 1921. Member of Constitutional convention in 1920. Representative from the eighth district in 1925 and from the eighteenth district in 1927. First representative to have served the state from three different districts. Speaker of the House of representatives in 1927, the only speaker elected from Omaha since Nebraska has been a state. State senator in 1929. Member of the Methodist church, Masons, and Delta Upsilon fraternity. Address: Omaha.

HENRY F. SCHEPMAN (Democrat). First district. Was born in a log cabin at Lockwood, Dade county, Missouri, September 26, 1898. German parentage. Lived near Shandoah, Iowa. Moved to Nebraska in 1907. Graduate of Tecumseh high school and arts and science college and law college of the University of Nebraska. Has attended the University of Chicago. Formerly was a farmer; is now a lawyer. State representative from Johnson county in 1925 and state senator in 1929; secretary to Congressman John H. Morehead during the 69th and 72d sessions of congress. Is an ex-service man. Married December 6, 1928, to Sherlie Whitaker. Member of Dramatic club of University of Nebraska, American Legion, and Delta Theta Phi (college fraternity). Attends Lutheran church. Address: Falls City.

PERLEE W. SCOTT (Republican). Twenty-ninth district. Was born in Kirksville, Iowa, July 24, 1860. His ancestors emigrated from Ireland to America in 1800. Educated in the Iowa public schools and Parsons college at Fairfield, Iowa. Settled in Nebraska in 1885. Married Jessie Ware, November 6, 1892. Has three children. He is a lawyer. Has been a member of the school board and the Imperial town board. He was county attorney of Chase county for twenty years, a member of the constitutional convention of 1919-20, and of the state senate in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Attends the Methodist church. Is a Mason and an Odd Fellow. Address: McCook.

HENRY MONROE SPRINGER (Republican). Thirty-third district. Born in Green Castle, Sullivan county, Missouri. Ancestry German. Came to Nebraska in 1889. Attended public schools. Married Alice Bottenberg in 1882; five children. Is a banker, stockman, and farmer. Was county commissioner in Scotts Bluff county for fifteen years. Is mayor of Mitchell, Nebraska. Affiliated with the Methodist church and a member of the Masonic lodge. Address: Mitchell.

HUGO F. SRB (Democrat). Eighth district. Native Nebraskan. Born in Dodge, Nebraska. Father came from Bohemia in 1876; mother in 1890. Attended public schools of Dodge, Wayne State Normal School, and the Law College of the University of Nebraska. Married Frances Grace Davey, June 16, 1926; two children. Is a practicing lawyer. Has taught school. Is a member of the board of education. Belongs to the Congregational church, the American Legion, and Phi Alpha Delta (college fraternity). Address: Dodge.

CHARLES S. TOOLEY (Democrat). Twenty-third district. Born in Boonville, Indiana, March 10, 1871. Ancestry Scotch-Irish. Came to Nebraska in 1885. Was educated in Broken Bow public schools. Married Harriet Sue Chrisman, October 27, 1897. Taught school and farmed. Later was a hardware merchant. Was a member of Broken Bow city council for twelve years; a member of the board of education of Broken Bow for twelve years; mayor of Broken Bow for three years. Served as president of Custer county agricultural society two years; and as chairman of the Democratic central committee of Custer county one year. Was a member of the Presbyterian church where he was chairman of the board of trustees. Belonged to the Masons (Knights Templar, Thirty-second Degree) and Rotary Club. Deceased, December 22, 1931.

RALPH R. VANCE (Republican). Twenty-sixth district. Born at Ripley, Ohio, in 1869. His ancestors were Scotch and Irish. He settled in Nebraska in 1887. Was educated in the common schools. He married Anna V. Frisch, March 12, 1905. They have two children. Has engaged in farming, milling, grain buying and banking. He attends the Presbyterian church. Was a state representative in 1919, 1921, 1923, and senator in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Has been vice-president of the State bank of Hastings for ten years, vice-president of the Hastings milling company for eight years, secretary of the Farmers' grain and supply company for fifteen years, director of the Hastings mutual fire insurance company for fourteen years and township treasurer for three years. Address: Hastings.

ROLLA C. VAN KIRK (Republican). Fourteenth district. Representative in 1927 and 1929. Born February 13, 1894 at Neligh, Nebraska. Married December 27, 1924, to Lenore Burkett; one child. Ancestors came from Holland. Attended

Neligh high school, Yankton college and University of Nebraska. Is a lawyer. Has been a teacher, postal clerk and soldier. Is a Methodist. Belongs to Alpha Sigma Phi, Phi Alpha Delta, A. F. & A. M., B. P. O. E., and American Legion. Address: Lincoln.

CHARLES JOSEPH WARNER (Republican). Fifteenth district. Representative in 1901, 1903, 1905 and state senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927, and 1929. Born in Lancaster county, Nebraska, 1875, of Swedish ancestry. Attended Lutheran academy in 1891-1892, Lincoln normal university, 1894, and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1899, and from the Columbian law school, Washington, D. C., 1902. Mr. Warner is a progressive farmer and president of the Lancaster farmers' state bank. Is a member of the Congregational church; Masons (Scottish Rite, Knights Templar), and Modern Woodmen. Address: Waverly.

ANDY J. WELCH (Democrat). Eighteenth district. Born at Milford, Nebraska, in 1875. Married January 1, 1896 to Mary Birky; two children. Attended public school. Is a merchant and farmer. Served four terms on village board and six terms on school board. State senator in 1929. Belongs to Methodist church and M. W. A. Address: Milford.

HERMANN GODFREY WELLENSIEK (Republican). Twenty-fourth district. Born on September 28, 1884 at Syracuse, Nebraska. Married September 12, 1925 to Anna Blanche Swartwood. One son. Ancestors came from Germany. Attended Syracuse high school and college of law, University of Nebraska. Has been a farmer and banker; is now a lawyer. Served as city attorney of Grand Island and Harvard and state senator in 1929. Belongs to Evangelical Synod of North America, A. F. & A. M., Elks, and Riverside golf club. Address: Grand Island.

KENNETH SPICER WHERRY (Republican). Sixteenth district. Born at Liberty, Nebraska, February 28, 1892. Married in 1920 to Margery Cowell; two children. Ancestors emigrated from Wales in 1790 and settled in Pennsylvania. Attended Pawnee high school, University of Nebraska and Harvard University. Is a merchant. Has been a member of the town council and mayor of Pawnee City and member of state senate in 1929. Is a Presbyterian. Address: Pawnee City.

ANTON MARINUS ANDERSON (Democrat). Fifty-sixth district. Representative in 1927. Born at N. Kongesler, Denmark, July 1, 1872. Came to Nebraska in 1889. Married Gertrude Jespersen, October 24, 1900. Five children. Attended common schools and Grand Island business college. Is a farmer. Has been a member of the school board, and justice of the peace, road overseer, official of Farmers' union for many years, secretary of Nuckolls county anti-thief association. Is a member of Lutheran church. Address: Oak.

EMIL ANDERSON (Democrat). Seventy-third district. Representative in 1925. Born in Sweden, September 14, 1868. Came to America with his parents in 1869. Settled in Nebraska in June, 1876. Was educated in the public schools. Married Selma Anderson, April 19, 1913. Is a retired farmer. Is a director of the Farmers elevator and of the First national bank. Is president of the Kearney county co-operative creamery. Is a member of the Lutheran church and Modern Woodmen. Address: Minden.

E. E. BINFIELD (Democrat). Sixty-eighth district. Member of legislature in 1929. Address: Prosser.

JOHN SKELTON BISHOP (Republican). Thirty-fourth district. Born at Lyons, Wayne county, New York, September 3, 1861. Came to Nebraska in 1887. Married June 20, 1894, to Cora L. Knapp, deceased; two children. Married February 15, 1931, to Mrs. Alice J. Cornell. Ancestors came from England in 1630. Graduated from commercial college 1878, Lyons union school 1881, Union college, Schenectady, 1884 with degree of A.B.C.E., Albany law school 1887, with degree of LL.B. Is a

lawyer; was formerly a civil engineer. Was a member of Lincoln city council, 1900-1905, and of Nebraska legislature, 1929. Is a Baptist. Thirty-second degree Mason and Shriner. Address: Lincoln.

GEORGE WILSON BIVENS (Republican). Sixty-ninth district. Sergeant-at-arms of the 1923, and 1925 sessions of the legislature. Native Nebraskan. Born at Milford, July 18, 1875. Attended public schools. Married Cora Emma Thum, September 30, 1902; two children. Was a farmer. Has been township clerk, county supervisor, steward of the State Hospital (Ingleside), secretary of the county Farm bureau, and director of Adams county fair board. Is a member of Methodist church, Lions Club, Royal Neighbors, Knights of Pythias, Modern Woodmen, and Masons. Address: Hastings.

SAMUEL C. BLACKMAN (Republican). Fiftieth district. Born in Dupage county, Illinois, September 26, 1867. Attended public schools and Wheaton college. Came to Nebraska in 1905. Married Grace Lockwood, November 10, 1892. She died in 1912. In 1919 married Edith Cunningham. Has four children. Taught school, served as a postmaster in Iowa, and began newspaper career there in 1895. Is publisher of the "Tilden Citizen." Has been register of deeds of Madison county, member of the school board, secretary of the chamber of commerce, secretary of Madison county fair association, and member of the Tilden library board.
